How to Prepare for a Socratic Seminar

Use the following materials:

- Your *Gatsby* book
- The assignment sheet
- The list of seminar questions
- Your Signposts notes
- Your notes from the themes discussion
- The Four A's and Transitional Phrases handout
- Lined paper or a new Google doc
 - All notes must be on paper, so if you use Google docs, don't forget to print!

Follow these steps:

- 1. If working with a partner, use the Norms of Collaboration handout and the Four A's and Transitional Phrases handout to practice using those when discussing
- 2. Read the first question on the list of seminar questions
- 3. Brainstorm parts from the text that would help you answer the question
 - a. Remember, if someone else gives your quote first, you can't get credit for sharing that quote
 - b. The more parts you think of, the more likely you will have enough quotes just in case
- 4. Find those parts in the book and mark them or write down the quote(s) with page numbers
- 5. Write notes for how to answer the question
- 6. Repeat steps 2 5 for the remaining questions on the sheet
- 7. When you finish answering all of the questions, write several divergent and/or higher order questions to ask during the seminar

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
