

Human Rights PSA Presentations

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights spells out how every human on Earth should be treated, but the UDHR does not have the force of law. Because of this, human rights are violated on a daily basis all around the world.

Your task for this assessment is to do the following:

1. Research a recent world issue that you believe violates at least one human right
 - Recent = within the past two years
 - World issue = a significant event or series of events that have taken place in a country outside of the U.S. and its territories
2. Determine which human right or rights the issue violates and how it violates them
3. Put together a PSA presentation that informs your audience of the issue, the violations of the UDHR, and why this issue should matter to people outside of that country or area
 - Use Google Slides
4. Present your PSA to the class

General Requirements:

- Find a minimum of three credible sources which answer the following questions:
 - Where and when does the issue take place? Is it still happening?
 - What is the specific issue?
 - Who specifically is involved?
 - What conditions allowed this issue to take place?
 - Which article or articles of the UDHR did the situation violate, and how did it violate them?
 - What impact is this issue having on the people involved?
 - Why should other people care about this issue?
- Create a Works Consulted page in MLA format for your three sources
- Create a Google slideshow that meets the following requirements:
 - A title slide with the name of your topic, your name, and a relevant picture
 - A map of the specific area/town/province (whichever applies) to show the audience where the violation(s) have or are taking place
 - Visually appealing, relevant pictures that correspond with your verbal presentation
 - Limited text (all slides should follow the Rule of Five “5X5”)
 - Correct spelling and grammar
- Create a verbal presentation that includes the following information:
 - A compelling hook (powerful photo, short video (under 1 min.), rhetorical question)
 - Information that answers the research questions above
 - A compelling closer

When you present, you will be graded on the following criteria:

- The effectiveness of your hook
- The amount of quality information you provide
- Whether or not you answer all of the research questions
- The effectiveness of your closer
- Whether or not your presentation is organized logically
- Whether or not your visual aid followed the Rule of Five
- Whether or not you were prepared and knew your material without the excessive use of notes

These presentations will take place starting Monday, September 30th. Before you present, you must submit your Works Consulted page as well as your “How I used my Feedback” prompt to turnitin.com.
