## **REVISION PROCESS PERSONAL NARRATIVE**

- 1. Find 2 other people with which you feel comfortable reading your personal narrative. In other words, you will either form groups of 3 to get this done more efficiently OR you will meet with 2 different people one-on-one throughout the process; it doesn't matter, you just need to meet with 2 in total.
- 2. Give a slip of lined paper to each person who is listening to your narrative (rip a lined sheet of paper in half).
- 3. Sit down and have one person in the group read his/her essay OUT LOUD to the rest of the group. DO NOT SIMPLY PASS PAPERS AROUND TO EACH OTHER.
- 4. As the writer is reading, the other 2 members of the group will write down their own name along with 2 questions, 2 suggestions, and 1 compliment on their slip. The questions and suggestions need to be content related. Also, make the compliment specific. Don't just say, "nice job!"
- 5. When the writer is done reading and the other group members are done filling out slips, each person takes a turn reading the questions, suggestions, and compliments OUT LOUD to the writer. This needs to be done in case the writer needs clarification and to make sure he/she understands the feedback.
- 6. The slips are then handed to the writer, and the next person begins reading his/her paper OUT LOUD following the same process.
- 7. When everyone in the group is done, each person needs to staple the 2 slips to the TOP of his/her rough draft (from yesterday)
- 8. After this process is done, each writer needs to make at least 3 CONTENT CHANGES to his/her essay based on the questions and suggestions.
